

 33.3% of YC adults have been diagnosed as having a depressive disorder, which has risen from 21.2% since 2014.



Level of Agreement With the Statement: "I am confident in my ability to manage stress and work through life's difficulties."









Mental Health Has Gotten Worse Since the Beginning of the Pandemic (Yellowstone County, 2023)









Perceived Level of Stress On a Typical Day (Yellowstone County, 2023)





Perceive Most Days As "Extremely" or "Very" Stressful




Perceive Most Days as "Extremely" or "Very" Stressful (Yellowstone County, 2023)







 In less than 10 years, the number of YC adults reporting the inability to access necessary mental health services has more than doubled.






Frequency of Having Social and Emotional Support (Yellowstone County, 2023)


"Seldom/Never" Have Social and Emotional Support (Yellowstone County, 2023)





Key Informant Input

Key informants highlighted topics such as:

- Access to Services, with focuses on a lack of providers/services, and accessing preventative, timely, affordable, "whole patient" care.
- Stigma and hesitancies when considering or seeking care.
- Desire for more educational/awareness efforts to discuss individual and community-level issues, impacts, and strategies for progress.

"There is a major lack of access to mental health services for both adults and children. The good thing is that mental health is becoming so much more accepted and talked about in U.S. communities. Due to COVID-19, the need for mental health specialists is continuing to increase however, the amount of people in these occupations is not high enough to take care of the community's needs." — Community Leader

"There is not "whole patient care" in our medical facilities and not good coordination between the medical facilities and mental health services."
